# I LOOK "DOWN" WHEN I WALK #1: NO MORE "SUKIYAKI"

## International Affairs Department

Members of the International Affairs Department have some opportunities to go abroad. I, a person of sewage works, instinctively look for a manhole in town and automatically take a picture when I find it. In this newsletter, I will introduce the manhole covers of the cities I visited.

## 1. BANGKOK, THAILAND

I took this photo when I visited Wastewater Management Authority (WMA), where Saitama Prefecture provides technical support. The cover has an abbreviation for Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA). People use the acronym for it because, in Thai, BMA spells กรุงเทพมหานคร, Wèi@ànisee àiātaeuł@A@g cigarette end sticking in it.

## 2. HANOI, VIETNAM

This cover is from Hanoi, Vietnam. It has a description of 1985. In Vietnam, hydrogen sulfide corrosion is becoming a problem, and the country needs the introduction of Japanese technology for hydrogen sulfide control.

In Hanoi, people cook using coal briquettes on the street. Because people throw coal cinders into street gutters, they flow into sewers. Education for public health might be required.

#### 3. DONG THAP PROVINCE, VIETNAM

Dong Thap Province is in Mekong Delta in southern Vietnam, and I took this photo in Cao lanh, the capital city of Dong Thap. Their sewerage is under construction, and the manhole cover is the latest model with an arrow describing the direction of wastewater. The letter "DOWASEN" on the manhole cover stands for Arsenic Removal and Waste Water Treatment.

## 4. KYIV, UKRAINE

JS is entrusted with a support operation for the design of sewage works project by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA.) I took these photos when I visited Kyiv for a field study.

The sewerage of Kyiv is a separate system. Two different patterns of manhole covers below seem to represent wastewater and rainwater, respectively.

JS is also entrusted with Iraq Project from JICA. These photos were taken during another field survey in Erbil, Iraq. While the new construction of sewerage has just started in Erbil, the manhole covers on the left already have a letter of "sewerage" on them.

I also found a manhole in the Citadel of World Heritage, constructed six thousand years ago. I'm wondering if the manhole is six thousand years old.
