1. SUPPORT FOR WMA: JICA GRASSROOTS TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROJECT BY SAITAMA PREFECTURE

JS has been supporting JICA Grassroots Technical Cooperation Project executed by Saitama prefecture since 2012. The project is now in its seventh year

through Phase 1 from April 2012 to March 2015 and Phase 2 from February 2016 to January 2019. We work in both Thailand and Japan, and it is a back-and-forth operation between the two countries.

Phase 1 focused on O&M support.

Phase 2 has added public-private
partnership support in addition to
O&M. The new support menu includes
establishing a WMA training center,
hosting a technical seminar to
promote technologies developed by
Saitama local companies, and
educational operation for Thai
people. The first technical
seminar that attracted peoples'

2. INTERNATIONAL STANDARDIZATION ACTIVITIES: ISO/TC275 MEETING IN YOKOHAMA

ISO/TC275 for sludge recovery, recycling, treatment, and disposal was established in February 2013, according to the French proposal. Japan joins the TC as one of Participating (P) Members who actively participate by voting on the standard at various stages of its development. JS and Japan Sewage Treatment Plant Constructors Association (JSCA) have been working as members of the national mirror committee.

In 2017, ISO/TC275 had its meeting in Japan for the first time, and Japan began to have two missions joining the discussion and hosting the meeting.
